On timely practicing and preparation as we move toward concerts!

If you are attempting to figure out why the first half of last night's rehearsal went so well and the second half did not, don't feel badly – I'm struggling with that as well. Simply making the statement the ensemble 'hadn't adequately prepared' is an easy cop-out. To say that the ensemble was not uniformly prepared might be more to the point.

It was evident last night that we had members who knew their music and could play every piece to tempo with minimal errors. We also had members who did not know their music and were unable to play every piece to tempo with multiple errors. That's where we were.

My recommendations are:

- 1. Find those sections of 'every piece we are playing' that present you with technical, rhythmic, or musical challenges!
- 2. Practice those passages at a time slow enough that no mistakes can be made and then gradually increase tempo to performance tempo.
- 3. Then read through the entire piece to tempo.
- 4. If you only have limited time, practice only those sections that you are unable to play to tempo.

Conductor intervention steps moving forward:

- Both Dr. LeBeau and I will take time during rehearsal to continue to identify sections are not being played to where they should be at this point.
- 2. Once identified, we both will provide intervention by working those parts out as a band, as sections, and part. Tempo will be slowed and gradually increased.
- 3. If those steps do not resolve the challenges, we could might resort to cutting parts/players and having cues played, or simply not having parts played. This is consistent with how these challenges have been addressed in the past so, nothing new, just reminding the ensemble of what needs to be done.
- 4. As I stated last night, I practice my scores almost daily and work to clear up conducting confusion by slow practice on my part. Thus, I expect that our members go through the same process with their music. Again, nothing new and just reminding the ensemble what needs to be done.
